MR. DULBERG: I don't know enough about it to object or not object.

THE COURT: I'm comfortable that I do, and so I'm going to grant the motion, because the appeal was dismissed. That is on the docket, so I am going to grant the motion to dismiss those defendants with prejudice.

What else are we doing today?

MR. KOST: Well --

MR. CHAPMAN: I --

MR. KOST: Go ahead.

open. That certainly is why I'm here.

But I don't believe there is anything further to address here. I know that in your Honor's order relative to the motion for sanctions you invited a further pleading on that matter, and I will allow those who are participating there to speak to that, if they have any need to, but I don't think there is any other reason to have anything further addressed here today or on further dates set.

MR. LONG: Judge, I agree with Jeremy, with the exception of Mr. Chapman, who obviously was invited to spindle a motion to present his fees and what he's seeking in sanctions.

But other than that, I think the case is over.

THE COURT: Okay. I thought so. But there is such a complex bunch of pleadings here and there, I wanted to make sure.

Who was about to speak? Was that you, Mr. Dulberg?

MR. DULBERG: Yes. We, on July 15th, 2023, we submitted a document, which were basically seven different motions, and two of

them don't seem to be relevant much more, but we were asking for a motion to strike from the record Talarico's response, Plaintiff's response to Defendant ADR Systems of America LLC's Rule 137 motion for sanctions filed on February 8th, 2024, because Talarico is extremely, extremely hostile to our interests and basically in multiple ways has been sabotaging our case --

MR. LONG: Judge, I don't want to hear anything about my client.

MR. DULBERG: May I continue to speak?

May I continue to speak?

THE COURT: Stop. Stop, Mr. Long.

Let's let Mr. Dulberg go ahead, and I'll let you have something to say. I'm going to have something to say, too, but I'll let you have something to say, Mr. Long.

But go ahead, Mr. Dulberg. Go ahead.

MR. DULBERG: Yes. So we were asking for a motion to strike from the record Talarico's response of February 8th, 2024, and a motion to resubmit our own response because Talarico simply

does not represent us; far from it. He is extremely, extremely hostile to the interests of my entire family and has done incredibly cruel things to us.

We also asked for a motion to compel Talarico to provide us with our case files. We never received any case files from Talarico, and per contract, as I have at www.fraudonthecourt.net in group exhibits -- slash exhibits, in Group Exhibit 46, I have all the contracts between us and Talarico, and it's all by the hour, and he's required to give us our case files. He didn't follow any of his contractual obligations regarding case files.

We also asked for the unredacted and complete record of reported telephone conversations between us, because it would go right to the heart of the issue of who is actually responsible for the resulting 137 sanctions.

I don't want to go too fast. I have a couple other things, and I have a list here. I could just submit the list, possibly, to the court reporter, if it's okay with you, so we

can put a complete --

MR. LONG: It's not okay with me.

MR. DULBERG: Okay. Fair enough. Then

I'11 --

THE COURT: Mr. Long. Mr. Long, hold up. I can just say what's okay about what gets said here, okay? So I understand you might have something to say in response or that you'd rather certain things not go uncontradicted on the record, so I'm going to let you have your say, but I get to decide who has their say.

And so you hold your horses for the time being.

Mr. Dulberg, your motion and the list of things that you wanted, they're all on the docket. So tell you what, I'm going to ask you, Mr. Long, to be the person who reflects -- sends us an order that reflects what I'm about to say:

A couple of things, Mr. Dulberg. Even if you didn't think that Mr. Talarico was appropriately representing your interests as far as the motion for sanctions was concerned, his interests were at stake as well. And so he had

absolute right to put forth whatever he thought was in his best interest to defeat the motion for sanctions. And you may have the opinion that you had different interests as far as that motion was concerned. I did not see that. And your interests are basically intertwined, in that he's responsible for what he wrote, and you're responsible for what he wrote. And that would be vice versa as well: You're jointly responsible. Lawyer and client are responsible for pleadings made by a lawyer.

Now, you were free to present things independently, if you so chose, but the punch line, as far as I was concerned, is that I looked at the petition for sanctions on its merit, and I looked at what was the conduct for which ADR sought to sanction you and your attorney, and I did not see -- I think -- you know, the order mentioned -- I couldn't imagine -- I'm paraphrasing, but I couldn't imagine a basis on which there was reasonable grounds for the breach of contract complaint against ADR.

And so as far as any pleadings on

the motions for sanctions are concerned, I guess I'll just say that your request for any further right to file other pleadings is denied, except to the extent that you may want to file something in response to Mr. Chapman's petition for fees. Because that's the one thing that I anticipate is still on the way. So that's number one.

And I guess secondly, I'm going to deny your request for any relief against

Mr. Talarico as far as your files, because that's not in front of me. You know, those sorts of disputes between lawyers and their clients are sometimes the result -- they are sometimes disputes that produce other litigation, but I don't have any basis for reviewing your request for files. There are ways in which clients are supposed to address those requests. I don't know whether you have, but those requests aren't supposed to be handled here. So I'm going to deny your request for anything to do regarding a dispute over files between you and Mr. Talarico.

Now, I'll also say I am not expressing any opinion, nor am I in a position to express an opinion or make any ruling on anything

that you're suggesting that Mr. Talarico did that was adverse to the interests of you or your family. Again, I only decide what's in front of me and what's in front of me based on what this case has been about.

So that's all I'm going to say about those motions. I don't think you need to list them for the sake of the court reporter, because they are all already on the docket.

So, Mr. Long, I'm going to ask you to just send us an order reflecting that I'm denying those motions that were already on the docket.

Now, Mr. Long, do you want to -- have something to say on behalf of your client, go right ahead.

MR. LONG: Yes. I'll just kind of work from the back.

Judge, what I was going to do is put together an order indicating that all pending motions filed by Mr. Dulberg are denied -- just so we're all clear -- and any requests by Mr. Dulberg relative to Mr. Talarico's file as to -- that's the language I'm going to use, if
